Hot Topic - Mailboxes

As reported at the annual meeting, the Board has discussed ways to make the neighborhood mailboxes more uniform in accordance with the restrictions. Over the years, residents have used various shades of green and different numbering styles to maintain their mailboxes. We considered doing a complete refurbishment of the current mailboxes, but determined this would be too costly. We have decided instead to purchase new address plates (pictured to the right), for all Wildwoods mailboxes (cost approximately \$6000), and provide a paint color SKU for everyone to use.

A poll at the annual meeting concerning the color of the mailboxes, either staying with the hunter green, or changing to black, was about 50/50. After consulting with a professional painter, we were advised to stick with the green, to avoid advanced fading of the paint, which would happen more easily with the black.

Please use:

- Rust-Oleum Hunter Green Oil Base SKU# V7538 is the chosen color. It can be purchased at Lowe's in a 32oz can for \$9.58, which will be plenty. We also recommend to brush paint the box, and use Rust-Oleum Hunter Green spray paint SKU# 7733830, for the hard to reach places.
- If any resident would like to purchase a new mailbox or a refurbished one, please contact Scott Vincent at (502)643-1042.
- For painting only, you may contact Glenn Bridges at (502)777-2855. He charges \$35, or \$50, if he supplies the paint.

It is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain their mailbox, so if yours is in need of renewal, we encourage you to take care of it as soon as possible.

We have a beautiful neighborhood, with very nice homes, so a well-maintained mailbox will only enhance your property.

Please look for your new address plate to arrive in the next 4-6 weeks!
